Outputs

“Cultivating Resilience in Health: Towards Unified Equitable Strategies for climate adaptation and mitigation in Africa”

- The *Harare Declaration on Climate and Health in Africa*, which will articulate Africa’s commitments and call for action to building people-centred, equity-oriented climate resilient health systems providing clear frameworks for the implementation of strategies discussed during the conference.

Sustainability commitment

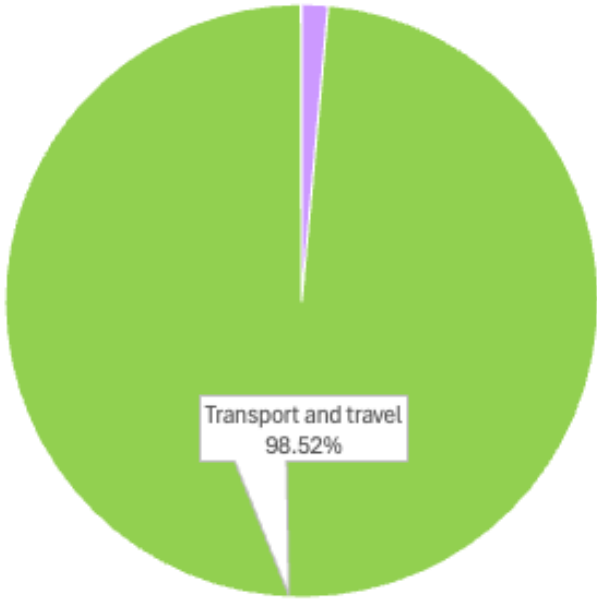
Together with the host venue we will aim to run CHAC Conferences as sustainably as possible,:
